

ACTION STEPS

Join us in stopping the passage of the <u>Safer Kentucky Act (HB5)</u>, this bill includes multiple policies that increase mass incarceration and further criminalize poverty. It includes provisions to ban camping to directly target folks who are homeless, involuntarily commit people experiencing mental health crises, and create a drug-induced homicide law.

Action Items:

- 1. **Send a letter from your organization to the bill sponsors** highlighting your concerns with the bill. <u>Instructions here</u>.
- 2. **Sign on to our organizational** <u>letter of opposition</u> that will go to the committee and bill sponsors <u>here</u>.

Free Birth Certificates for those who are Homeless- <u>HB100</u>**-** Gives free Birth Certificates to anyone homeless and born in Kentucky.

- 1. **Call the legislative Hotline to voice support for this bill.** Have your staff, board, Supporters, volunteers, and guests do the same.

<u>House Bill 5 Doubles Down on Ineffective Policies That Will Further Increase</u> <u>Incarceration and Hardship</u> The House on Thursday passed House Bill 5, a collection of dangerous, tried-and-failed policies that will increase the risk of overdose death, worsen our already globally high incarceration levels, squeeze out funding for investments that actually make our communities safer and further entrench Kentuckians in poverty. Prior to passage, the bill was amended by House Floor Amendment 27, which added even more harmful provisions while making minimal changes to improve the bill.


